JULIE is a free service, available to everyone. Call 811 two days prior to starting your project to have any underground utility lines in your yard marked for no charge.

JULIE also offers a new self-service option. JULIE's new E-Request allows homeowners and contractors to submit a request online. It's a quick and easy alternative that's available at all hours. All you need is a valid e-mail and home address to complete the online form. You will then receive a confirmation email with your dig start date and time.

3. I'm not digging deep enough. *Depths can vary over time and lines can get closer to the surface without you knowing it.*
4. I'm not working in an area that needs marking. *Don't take the chance. Be safe before it's too late.*
